

The show follows a story around the seasons of a year in India from Divali, the Indian new year and festival of lights, to the wedding season, monsoon, rainy season, drought, spring and harvest season where people rejoice and celebrate the cycle of new life. Each class will be allocated a dance or musical item that will be taught to them through storytelling during the residency.
