THE PERFORMER AND THE CHARACTER

Brian Nankervis created the character of **Raymond J. Bartholomeuz** in 1985. Raymond first stormed the set of "**Hey Hey, It's Saturday**" in 1986, winning Red Faces with a poem called "**Days by the Ocean**"...

I am an island, I am an isthmus I come from Bermuda, I don't believe in Christmas

...he has since continued to perform his verse on TV (*Hey Hey, Bookchat, Bert Newton*), radio (*ABC, 3RRR, Fox*), with bands (*TISM, Southern Sons*), in theatres, comedy venues and schools

Raymond has published a book of poems – "*Too many Crayfish Not Enough Brains*" (McPhee Cribble, Penguin) and, in 1995, a CD with seven year old Matt Healey – "*A Wet Bird Never Flies At Night*"

His poems are hilarious, passionate, satirical and sometimes unexpectedly poignant. He writes about lost love, new love, broken hearts and spas. Politics, sport, religion and the baths. Lady Di, Bart Simpson, school bullies and Uncle Eric the dentist from hell

Brian Nankervis (the alter ego of **Raymond** J), was a primary school teacher for six years until a curriculum sub committee got the better of him. He has been an actor/ writer in TV shows including *Let the Blood Run Free* (Ch 10), *Boys and Balls* (ABC) and *Jimeoin* (Ch 7)

A 50 minute presentation from Raymond comprises a poetry performance tailored to suit the interests and ages of the students, information and anecdotes about a wide range of professional media experiences (utilising video highlights if appropriate), a group poetry writing exercise and a question & answer session.
