A Puppet Show by Jeremy Lavender



The story is of an inventor, Dr Doovalacky, who, with the help of his assistant, a green caterpillar named Gizmo, sets out to build a robot. But this will be no ordinary robot! Trinket will have the ability to have feelings like a "real" human. The audience helps him to learn about the world, but quickly it becomes more complicated. Dr Doovalacky finds himself losing control of his own creation.

Trinket learns that to become human is to not only feel wonder and joy, but also to feel other emotions like anger, fear and the sadness of saying goodbye to someone when you are not ready to. Having feelings is not easy and to be alive means making difficult choices. *Trinket the Robot* is an interactive solo puppet show that provokes a discussion about emotional literacy and provides a framework for younger children to identify their feelings.
